Welcome to Building Safer Communities!

The Building Safer Communities workshops have been set up because we want to hear from you – residents, community groups, schools, businesses – about how the council should spend your money to make your community safer.

Through participating in your local workshop, you'll have the opportunity to share your own experiences of the key issues (young people at risk of exploitation; domestic abuse; substance misuse; and anti-social behaviour), and come up with ideas for how to make your community safer. The best ideas will be developed into initiatives using the Community Crime Reduction fund, a pot of money totalling £90,000. Each area of the city – the north, centre and south of Portsmouth – will receive a total investment of £30,000 (£10,000 a year for three years) in the initiatives you come up with to reduce crime and anti-social behaviour in your community.
